Community-driven celebration launches The Art House, a new, luxury rental in Jersey City's Powerhouse Arts District



The Shuster Group has launched the leasing program for its new Art House luxury rental building in downtown Jersey City with a grand opening gala that both supported the local arts community and showcased the developer's commitment to creating a vibrant living experience that inspires social interaction.
